Wine in Australia VS. United States

History:

Hunter Valley was the first commercial region in 1828

Trends:

- Premiumisation- In 2016 Australia experienced double digit growth in almost all premium price points
- Convenience- Increasing expectation/desire of immediacy
- Blending of different wines

Legal/Political Information:

Wine is taxed 29% due to the wine equalisation tax (WET).

History:

Finger Lakes was the first commercial region in Pennsylvania in 1860s

Trends:

In America, trends are going towards larger, magnum bottles

Premium wines are also trending upward vs cheap wines

California Fires-- Experts predict with the large CA wildfires devastating regions in Northern California, wine buyers will want to help support the CA wine business.

Legal/Political Information:

In America, it is difficult to find affordable labor that is reliable with the seasonality of wine growing/harvesting

No GMOS used in grape growing, however big debate over GMO products used in wine production

- Shiraz, CS, Grenache main varietals

- 2,000 wine producers across Australia
- 7th largest wine producer in the world

Beginnings

- Discovered by David McLaren in 1839
- Oxenberry was the first winery and restaurant opened in McLaren Vale in 1840

Stats

- ▶ 54% of plantings are dedicated to Shiraz
- Home to 120 wineries
- Along 30 km of coastline

History

- Founded in 1991 by Sarah and Sparky Marquis
- Mollydooker means a left handed person in Australian
- Started the Marquis Vineyard Watering Programme
- Coined the term "Fruit Weight" (the percentage of your palate that's covered by the velvety sensation of fruit)
 - Wine must be 65%+ fruit weight to be considered a Mollydooker

Varietal/Product Overview

- Whimsical approach to all aspects of winery (labelling, winemaking, etc)
- ► A larger portion of the wines are shiraz/shiraz blends
 - Also offer verdelho, sparkling shiraz, merlot, cab sauv

History

- Established in 1973 by Tom Nelson
- Named after their iconic ironstone Chapel built in 1865
- Two vineyards, Winery (1977) and Kangarilla (1995)

Varietal Specialization/Product

- Best known for their Shiraz and Cabernet Sauvignon
- Wine spends 20 months maturing in barrel before being bottled unfined and unfiltered.
- Member of the Sustainable Australia Winegrowing (SAW) program

Location: The estate is in the hills McLaren Vale region less than a hour away

from Adelaide and within sight of the sea.

History: Founded in 1967 by Hugh and Molly Lloyd. The estate is still in the Lloyd family. The original Farmhouses were built in 1860 and are now the epicentre of the cellar door. Three years after they were founded in 1970 they released their first wine from the original vineyards that were planted immediately after WW1.

Varietal Specialization: Majority variety planted is Shiraz. Since 1985 use some Italian varieties. 65% Shiraz, 10% Sangiovese, 5% Chenin, 5% Cabernet Sauvignon.

Product Overview:Offer over 15 different wines and have a select few only available at the cellar door. They also offer lunch at the cellar door and they bottle olive oil.
